- Payment Plan is available at no additional charge to accommodate your family budget. Our online registration system allows for payments to be divided over 11 months at no additional charge.

REFUND POLICY:

- Since our financial budget is based on enrollment, parents are expected to commit to the program upon registration (registration is defined as status on class is "Enrolled") for the entire year. Refunds for tuition and material fees will not be given after you have enrolled in classes.
- We understand that classes close during registration, but please be mindful of this as you make your class selections at registration. Switching/withdrawing classes can jeopardize other classes and teacher's jobs; therefore, parents will be responsible for the financials of the class added and dropped if you choose to switch or withdraw from classes after enrolling a student. If a class is dropped and that seat can be filled, a refund may be given; otherwise, you are responsible for payment of the class.

Note: This is not to be confused with architectural drafting (the making of blue prints). These days drafting is mainly done using AutoCAD. However, this class would be technical drawing in the sense that a t-square and triangle are used (in effect creating a drafting table situation) for precision.

Description: In a world of increasing ideological diversity, students are being challenged to think through their own beliefs at an early age. Come Spring semester, students will become overcomers as they authentically learn their identity by using Ephesians Precept; inductive-study-style, where the word "study" is a verb, not a noun. In this semester, students will observe what the text says, interpret what it means, and apply it to their lives.

Based upon powerful insights from the scriptural book of Ephesians and the teacher's personal stories, students will be challenged to let the One who knows them best be the One who guides their heart the most. It's time for our students to live in the amazing light of His acceptance, abundance, and strength.

CLUBS

All 9th-12th Grade students are welcome to join any of the following Timothy Ministry Clubs. Membership is open the first part of semester 1 only. Annual Fee to join a club is \$25. Club Fees/Dues cover some club expenses, however there may be additional fees for projects and competitions that the club decides to participate in.

These clubs have been established to provide teens at Timothy Ministry the opportunity to grow in their interest, build friendships and use their gifts and talents.

In an effort to make club membership a valuable experience for all students, we ask Club Members to commit to the following:

- 1. ATTENDANCE at Meetings: Most meetings will be Tuesday afternoons from 4:00-5:00. There will be 1 (possibly 2) meetings per month. There may be additional meetings outside of Tuesdays. We don't require you to participate in all meetings, but members should be committed to attend most of the meetings. Yearbook and Journalism are now offered as classes (see details in class description).
- 2. PARTICIPATION: This club is STUDENT-LED. All club members are expected to participate in the club. This requires that the student has an interest in the club subject area and motivation to contribute to club goals and tasks.
- 3. WELCOMING ATMOSPHERE: The purpose of Timothy Ministry Clubs is to develop friendships among students who share common interests. Therefore, we want our club environment to be welcoming to all students. It is our desire for students to see this as an opportunity to deepen existing friendships as well as to meet new people.
- *What age can my son/daughter join a club? Students need to be 14 by September 1 of the current school year.
- *When will the clubs start? Clubs will begin in late August/September. They will meet once a month on Tuesdays from 4-5PM.
- *May I join more than one club? It is possible that some of the clubs will meet on the same Tuesday. Each club will have group projects, competitions and field trips that could be a time conflict with another club.
- *How do I sign up for a club? Each club now has a classID associated with it and when you register for classes, you can sign up for a club.

Description: This course is designed to help students evaluate and navigate the cultural and social landscapes that encourage doubt and uncertainty. When students ask tough questions, or express their doubts and share their uncertainty about Christianity, it indicates that they are "thinking for themselves." It is extremely important that we use this time to help them to think for themselves with respect to their faith.

Students will discover for themselves the answers to some of the most fundamental questions of life. Questions such as: the origin of the universe and life, the existence and nature of God, the nature of truth, morality, good and evil, and the only question that really matters – who is Jesus and why do Christians believe He is the only way to God?

Mr. Bocchino's Philosophy of Teaching: My philosophy of teaching is based upon the critical and constructive thinking skills and communication method used by Jesus. Students will take a journey with me into "The Mind of Christ" to discover for themselves how Jesus used certain principles of thought to get to the "truth-principle" that guided correct thinking about any issue. Jesus used the "self-discovery" aspects of teaching and communicating not by directly answering questions, but rather by responding to questions with the use of "principle - centered" questions. Jesus never hesitated to respond to controversial issues or tough questions. However, he very rarely answered a question with an answer. Rather, he responded to questions with questions.

The adjacent table shows a clear distinction between "Information Centered Thinking" (fact-based) and "Principle-Centered Thinking" (principle-based). It is a paradigm shift from "what to know" to "how to know"—from "what to think" to "how to think."

This philosophy of teaching takes students beyond the sphere of fact gathering for memorization and recall. It takes them into the realm of true learning as they discover how to think through the facts for themselves (reflective process) by applying truth- principles (self-evident truths) to the issues being discussed.

My standard for measuring progress is based how well students understand that every issue and question is based upon a truth principle (if true) or a false assumption (if false). They will also learn how to ask the right questions about the issue or question in order to discover the truth principle or false assumption. If done correctly, the truth will rise to the surface for self-discovery and the false assumption will be exposed or self-destruct. This is exactly how Jesus handled tough questions and controversial issues—by responding with "principle-centered" questions.

It is my prayer and strong belief that this course will provide a lasting foundation for students to face those philosophies opposing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It is also my prayer that this courses will build the right kind of confidence in each student in order to defend and share his or her faith.

This course is a level one high school foreign language class, earning 1 CU of foreign language credit. Students will spend approximately 5 hours a week in course study, meeting the minimum 150 hours of study for a foreign language credit.

Belt Testing is how students are able to <u>learn additional techniques</u> and <u>rank up in belts</u>. This is not required, but is STRONGLY RECOMMENDED to continue their progression.

Testing is offered 1x per semester and is held during regular class times. (Family Discounts Available: \$60 first family member and \$30 each additional paid directly to HCMA). Testing fees are due the day of testing unless other arrangements are made.

Students not testing will still be getting physical exercise and continue to improve their current techniques.

An HCMA t-shirt is available as for optional purchase for a "summertime" uniform (martial art pants, t-shirt, and rank belt). T-shirt in place of the uniform jacket can be worn at the beginning of the fall semesters and end of the end of the spring semesters.
