# **About Timothy Ministry:**

The Timothy Ministry was founded on I Timothy 4:12, "Let no one look down on your youthfulness, but rather in speech, conduct, love, faith and purity, show yourself an example of those who believe." Our passion for this ministry is evangelism, service and outreach of home school youth.

The Timothy Ministry is a non-profit organization whose purpose is to (1) present the gospel to each student that attends the ministry and aid students in accepting the love and salvation of Jesus Christ as the Holy Spirit convicts, training them to serve God and others in the church and community; (2) minister to student's and parent's needs as they arise; (3) provide the platform for students to learn to serve others; (4) provide quality instruction in the classroom.

Proverbs 22:6 "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old, he will not depart from it."

The Timothy Ministry wants to partner with the home school parent who wishes to supplement their child's home education with educational and enrichment classes. The Timothy Ministry is a home school support ministry - not a full-time school. It is the parent's responsibility to adhere to the Georgia Home School Law. The Timothy Ministry meets one day per week on Tuesday. There are two, 14-week sessions per school year. The first session begins in early August and ends in early December. The second session begins in early-mid January and ends in early May. Classes are available for grades K—12.

We offer a variety of academic classes for the middle school and high school ages. The teachers provide only a portion of the instruction needed and various assignments will be given to complete at home. Academic classes cannot be taught in one day of class instruction; therefore, parents remain the primary teacher for four days per week and The Timothy Ministry is a resource for the student's instruction one day per week. Our teachers will provide a grade or comment on the student's progress and assignments. We are not an accredited program; however, most of our academic teachers are certified/degreed teachers.

The Timothy Ministry is open to home school students, but reserves the right to refuse admittance of a student based on a history of illegal behavior or past records in prior schools or behavior deemed to be a detriment to the student body.

#### BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Timothy Ministry's Board of Directors' purpose is to set broad policies, protect the vision of the ministry, establish annual budgets, and plan for future growth.

#### TEACHERS

The roles we hold in The Timothy Ministry are not taken lightly. We have the opportunity to reach many lives and God has given us this platform to do so. As James 3:1 states, "My brethren, let not many of you become teachers, knowing that we shall receive a stricter judgment."

The Timothy Ministry follows the same guidelines and procedures set by FBCW for any preschool or elementary worker. Each person, before becoming an official worker, must have a one-on-one interview with the director and/or assistant director. In addition, the following forms are required to be completed: Personal Testimony, Bible Study Covenant, Ministry References, Criminal History Consent Form, Legal/Lifestyle Concerns, and Truths We Hold Dear.

Teacher qualifications are as follows:

- Professing Christian
- Church Member (of FBCW or a church of like faith and practice)
- Yielding to the Lordship of Jesus Christ
- Qualified/Degreed/Skilled in particular area of teaching
- Clear an official background check

About God - God is the Creator and Ruler of the universe. He has eternally existed in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. These three are co-equal and are one God.						
About the Father – He is all-powerful, all- knowing, all-loving, and all-wise. He reigns with providential care over the universe and the flow of human history goes according to His purposes and plan.						
About Jesus – Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He is co-equal with the Father. Jesus has eternally existed and became man at His incarnation. Jesus lived a sinless human life and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of all people by dying on a cross. He bodily arose from the dead after three days to demonstrate His power over sin and death. He ascended to Heaven's glory and will return someday to earth to reign as King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

Salvation is maintained by the grace and power of God, not by the self-effort of the Christian. It is the grace and keeping power of God that gives us this security.

About Eternity – People were created to exist forever. We will either exist eternally separated from God by sin or eternally with God through forgiveness and salvation. To be eternally separated from God is Hell. To be eternally in union with Him is eternal life. Heaven and Hell are real places of eternal existence.						
About Baptism by Immersion – We believe that scriptural baptism must be: (1) by being completely immersed under the water, and (2) must be after salvation. Jesus was immersed and all baptisms in the New Testament were by immersion. These two facts set the standard for baptism today. Baptism has no saving power but is the first act of obedience symbolizing (1) the believer's faith in the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus, (2) the believer's death to sin and resurrection to walk anew in Christ, and (3) the Christian's belief that he will die, be buried, and that Jesus will resurrect him from the dead.						
About the Lord's Supper – The Lord's Supper is a symbolic act of obedience whereby believers remember the death of the Lord Jesus and anticipate His second coming. The bread is symbolic of His body and the juice represents His blood.						
About Tithing – At First Baptist we believe in giving the tithe – 10% of gross income (not net) – as the biblical standard of giving. According to the scriptures we are to give cheerfully, regularly, systematically, proportionally, and liberally for the advancement of the Redeemer's cause on earth.
